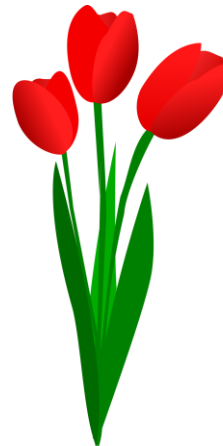
Message from Ellen
